Learn about bats

WANT to help save creatures that hang upside down, plant trees and use sound waves to find food? Boondall Wetlands Environmental Centre will host Bats - no me, no new trees activity on World Environment Day, on Tuesday June 5.

Bat expert Louise Saunders will host the seniors event, part of the Growing Older Living Dangerously program,

which will teach participants how bats help trees grow, the basics of bat rescue and how to build bat boxes.

Community Services Committee chairwoman Catherine Bermingham, said bats are an extremely important part of Brisbane's ecosystem.

"After feasting on seeds from trees and plants, bats excrete these seeds while flying and inadvertently

plant the seeds for new trees to grow," Cr Bermingham said.

"Bats have the potential to eat between 500 and 1000 insects in one hour, so providing bats with accommodation during the day means they're free to clean up nasty insects around the house at night."
